What is ACU Unitpulse?

ACU Unitpulse is a new online evaluation tool that lecturers at ACU can use to gather feedback from students about aspects of their unit and teaching during the teaching period.

The difference between this tool and the


Student Evaluation of Learning and Teaching (SELT) survey is that *ACU Unitpulse* provides formative feedback, which means that lecturers receive it immediately so they are able to address concerns while the unit is still running.

How does *ACU Unitpulse* work?

ACU Unitpulse works by allowing lecturers to ask their students questions, gain immediate feedback and then respond to this feedback.

Students can also provide anonymous and confidential feedback to their lecturers using *ACU Unitpulse*.

What *ACU Unitpulse* looks like:




