Associate Professor Jason Lodge has a long interest in learning and teaching, the science of learning, and the use of technology to enhance learning. This interest and expertise

will offer us an especially rich combination if we want to challenge ourselves toward different ways of thinking about learning and teaching, and more importantly to think about improved practice. Jason's interests and expertise are backed by a strong record of research and scholarship which concentrates on the application of the learning sciences to higher education. Specifically, he is interested in the cognitive and emotional factors that influence learning and behaviour and how research findings from the learning sciences can be better used to enhance design for learning, teaching practice and education policy. Jason is also interested in the ways technology is influencing learning, particularly in terms of the impact of technology on the development of professional ways of being, metacognition, critical thinking and expertise.

LTC provides a range of programs and services to support the professional development of academic staff, as well as the technology platforms to enable a contemporary student learning and academic teaching experience.


LTC is the ACU service lead for learning and teaching, including:
