AIMS	Learning outcomes
remember	Recognise, recall, identify, retrieve, name
understand	Interpret, paraphrase, translate, represent, clarify, exemplify, instantiate, illustrate, classify, categorise, subsume, summarise, abstract, generalise, infer, extrapolate, predict, conclude, compare, contrast, match, map, explain, construct models
apply	Execute, carry out, implement, use
analyse	Differentiate, discriminate, select, distinguish, focus, organise, outline, structure, integrate, find coherence, parse, attribute, deconstruct
evaluate	Check, test, detect, monitor, coordinate, critique, judge
create	Generate, hypothesise, plan, design, produce, construct

Summary:

Aims = what the teacher will do and = what will be evaluated.

Learning outcomes = what students must demonstrate and = what will be assessed

Learning outcomes represent the translation of aims into specific, tangible, attainable learning achievements, usually expressed as observable behaviour and reflecting what students will be able to do or accomplish.
